**Health Determinants Research Collaborations (HDRCs)** boost research capacity and capability within local government. They aim to embed a culture of always using evidence when making decisions. HDRCs use research findings to understand how decisions impact on health and health inequalities. They also carry out research where evidence isn't already available.

HDRC NY is an exciting collaboration between North Yorkshire Council, University of Hull and University of York (Centre of Health Economics) £5million over 5 years (2024-2028) from the Public Health Research Programme, National Institute of Health & Care Research. We are one of 30 HDRCs across the UK. The purpose of HDRCs is to support councils to become more research active: using and generating research to improve population health and reduce inequalities.

Our research priority areas include:

- Equitable access and outcomes in preventative services
- Improved health and wellbeing of coastal and rural communities
- Good work: securing better outcomes for workers and business
- Good quality, affordable and sustainable housing
- Climate change and health

With a focus on under-researched groups including:

- Military families and veterans
- Women's health and wellbeing
- Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities.

The HDRC North Yorkshire welcomes research ideas from community organisations that align with these priority areas. We can support linking organisations with key policy teams to build and strengthen collaborations and support on going and future pieces of research activity.

- [Health Determinants Research Collaboration \(HDRC\) Wakefield Council](#) will have three work streams:

- Core Capacity workstream will create a research development and governance function in the Council, supporting all aspects of the research process from initial ideas to design, governance and ethics, to application for external funding bids. We will also have a training and skills development offer for staff working at all levels of the Council and local VCSE organisations.
- Knowledge Translation and Behaviour Change workstream will work with teams and services across the Council to turn the evidence we generate into effective decisions, actions and policies. A key focus of this workstream will be a project with elected members, exploring ways to integrate research evidence into their decision making and scrutiny processes more effectively.
- Community Insight workstream will build a sustainable model for co-producing all aspects of research with local communities, supporting local people to become participants in research, and leaders and champions of it.
